

Veritas est deus noster  
St. Augustin's arithmetical proof of God

**Summary:** The less known arithmetical proof of God presented by St. Augustin may certainly be considered as one of the first christian arguments typically characterized by logical consistancy and unempirical reasoning. The most peculiar features consist in its arithmetical relations and in applying mathematical methods to theology. The validity of the proof could be demonstrated by means of propositional calculus. Further essential aspects are relevant definitions and meaning postulates pointing out the Augustinian concept that the analytical truth is God. Some problems are solved with special respect to Heinrich Scholz who firstly dealt with this highly interesting inference.
